Handbook

ORGANIZATION:

The Europe Cup will hold six different competitions:

- Three pool championships
- Three beach championships

ATHLETE PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:

- All participating teams have to be backed up by their full ILSE Member Association.
- The athlete will be able to take part up in all the championship events.
- The competition will be regulated by the host country in accordance with the ILSE Rulebook.
- The results of the Europe Cup will be obtained from the sum of the scores at the pool events or the sum of the scores at the beach events for each athlete and event. That final score will define the Europe Cup winner by event.
- To score in the overall ranking it will be necessary to have participated in at least 2 competitions/events of the circuit.
- There will be an overall ranking and therefore a female and a male Champion of the Europe Cup by event.
- In case of a tie in the overall ranking, the winner will be the athlete with the highest number of first positions. If the tie persists, the winner is decided on the highest number of second places, third places and so on.

ORGANIZING COUNTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- To request the hosting of a Europe Cup competition, the following documents must be presented within the established time:
 - The completed application form
 - Proof of payment (75 euros payable to ILSE)
- The championship will be run under the responsibility of the host country federation.
- Among all the hosting proposals received, it will be decided which countries hold each event.
- The host federation will be responsible for the organization of the event and the structure of every championship.
- All the events will be regulated by the current version of the ILSE Rulebook.
- All athletes must have their license issued by the ILSE (Full member) and their insurance policy issued by their own sporting federation.
- The championship results will be sent in neutral format .xls file and within a maximum period of 30 days after the end of the championship. Should these results not be received, they will not be taken into account in the overall classification of the Europe Cup.
- The organizers of each event are allowed to reward and/or give trophies to their participants at their own convenience.
